### Merit Badge Sponsorship Program

### San Francisco Bay Area Youth Benefits

The Merit Badge Sponsorship Program provides opportunities for at-risk youth in low-income and culturally diverse areas to grow physically, mentally, and morally in after-school and weekend activities. By attending Scouting's structured, safe activities, California's young people do not have as much idle time to explore drugs, alcohol, or find themselves in as many peer-pressure activities. The Scouting program is a year-round effort because the pressures on our young people increase every day. There is no better time than now to help guide youth in positive directions.

### Scouting addresses California's at-risk youth in the following ways:

- 1. Offering a place for youth to <u>attend after school and on weekends</u> at which he or she will learn how to be physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight
- 2. Teaching the youth how to avoid drug and alcohol abuse through the "Drugs: A Deadly Game" program
- 3. <u>Creating weekly opportunities</u> to assist the youth in learning a code of ethics: being trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent
- 4. Did you know that STEM program has existed in the Boy Scouts of America since the very beginning of our program? Some of the very first merit badges were STEM related. A great example is Computers merit badge which has been offered since 1968. That's much earlier than computers were adopted in the mainstream, and we have continued to be cutting edge including the recent release of the Robotics Merit Badge.

# Additionally, Scouting helps California's at-risk youth to focus on six critical elements of healthy youth development:

- 1. Strong personal values and character
- 2. Positive sense of self-worth and usefulness
- 3. Caring and nurturing relationships with parents, other adults, and peers
- 4. A desire to learn
- 5. Productive / Creative use of time
- 6. Social adeptness
